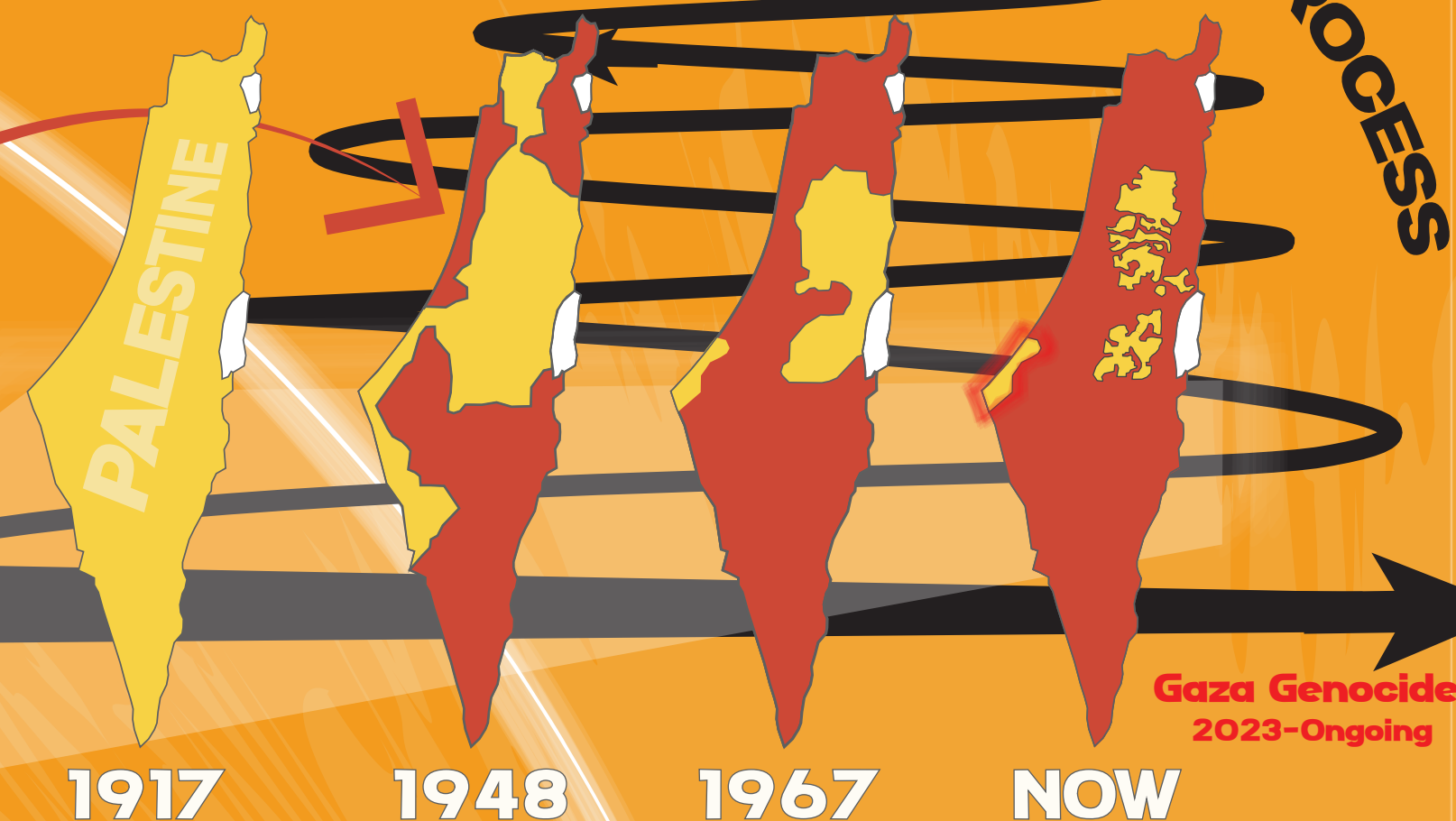

Decolonial (adj) **Definition:** Settler colonialism is viewed as an **ongoing**, lived experience where **Indigenous people** are continuously **subjected to erasure, violence, and land dispossession**, while simultaneously resisting these forces through culture, law, and politics. Coulthard, G. S. (2014)

ONGOING PROCESS

Prejudiced (adj) **Definition:** Settler Colonialism is a civilising mission, where settlers from advanced European societies establish permanent settlements in new lands.

Framed as a natural extension of progress and modernity (Verancini, 2010; Stoler, 2002)

While resource extraction is a component, settler colonialism is presented as a benevolent form of expansion that brings governance, capitalism, and societal

"advancement" to so-called undeveloped territories (Wolfe, 2006; Verancini, 2010).
